

# College Moving to Dominguez Hills Friday

President Leo F. Cain announced today that the specially designed facilities being built at 809 E. Victoria St., Gardena, for the California State College, Dominguez Hills (CSCDH) are now completed.

Originally scheduled for occupancy on Sept. 1, present indications are that the college will move to its new location on Friday. Extensive library shelving is currently

being installed as well as complete laboratory equipment.

"The college will be well settled in its new facilities," stated President Cain, "by the time the students arrive for the fall registration on Sept. 19."

JUNIORS entering in September 1966, will be able to select a field of concentration leading to a bachelor of

arts Degree from such areas as English, music, chemistry, mathematics, history, and psychology.

Freshmen, in addition to the above departmental major offerings, may choose from such fields as art, French, philosophy, Spanish, biological sciences, physics, economics, geography, political science, and sociology. Furthermore, the college's unique academic plan permits the student an additional interdepartmental major in such areas as East Asian studies, linguistics, theater arts, twentieth century thought and expression, earth and space sciences, foundations of natural science, information and communication systems, American business and economic systems, American studies, behavioral sciences, and environmental design and urban studies.

JUNIOR YEAR students, however, are limited to the areas of twentieth century thought and expression, the foundation of natural science, and American studies and behavioral sciences. These interdepartmental programs are designed to explore areas of study to which several disciplines contribute and draw upon the total offerings of the college, Dr. Cain said.

To support such a program the facilities now under construction have been designed specifically for the needs of a fully operative four-year college. For example, the science program will have at its disposal a complete biological science laboratory, both upper and lower division chemistry laboratories including a complete balance and instrument room, and adjacent equipment and material storage rooms.

For science and mathematics majors, the building will provide a specially designed room for calculating equipment, as well as provisions for student activities in the data processing and computer center.

STUDENTS majoring in a foreign language or taking course work in such an area will have the use of the latest foreign language facilities, including listening laboratories outfitted with the accretions of modern language learning techniques.

In the social sciences, in addition to a variety of different size lecture rooms, special facilities have been provided for laboratory work in the field of geography.

In the behavioral science program, a preparation room, psychological laboratories, and test booths have also been planned.

IN THE FINE arts field, the college will provide such facilities as instrumental and vocal practice rooms, as well as a theater arts laboratory and art laboratory room.

Fourteen lecture rooms and further modified in co-varying in capacity from 15 to 85 students are also included in the new structure, as well as a well-equipped audio-visual center. Student service operations will include office space and areas for counseling, placement, health services, and related activities. For the added convenience of the students, off-street parking will be made available and a campus dining room will be in operation.

THE COLLEGE will have an open stock library of 55,000 volumes with subscrip-

tion to approximately 650 periodicals. These current holdings represent an excellent basic library for a well-developed undergraduate program and evolved from a list developed from the Harvard-Lamont study, modified by the University of Michigan, and further modified in cooperation with the three new branches of the University of California. The library will also have a reserve room as well as space in the open stock room areas for student study and research.

To insure the development of such a rich academic program, outstanding faculty members have been recruited from all parts of the nation, and hold degrees from such institutions as Harvard, Columbia, Syracuse, New York University, University of Pennsylvania, North Western University, Stanford, Californ-

nia Institute of Technology, University of California, University of California at Los Angeles, and the University of Southern California, as well as the Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico.

CONSIDERING these new and extensive facilities, along with an outstanding faculty of approximately 30, and a student body limited initially in size, the individual student will be presented with an unusual opportunity for highly rewarding personal interaction with his instructor under almost ideal physical conditions, Dr. Cain said.
