

# Family Lawyer Akin to 'Spiritual Advisor'

 "Family lawyers" are becoming harder to find. Reason: many new lawyers are shunning general practice and entering specialized fields, particularly corporate law.

THE WATCH industry is wound up for another big year in 1966. Sales are expected to run 20 per cent ahead of 1965.

More than 68 per cent of jewelers interviewed in 45 cities said they not only expect rising sales this year but look for the forward pace to continue through 1967-68.

Harry B. Henshel, president of Bulova Watch Co., said the survey indicates that "industry-wide, we can look for domestic retail sales of watches and clocks to be sold in 1966 to be in the billion-dollar category." He noted that the domestic watch market alone has risen 33 per cent since 1963; nearly 35 million watches were sold in 1965.

estimated 19 million clocks were sold. Most of these were keywound and plug-in electric clocks, but the trend now is heavily toward cordless electric styles. Indeed, it is estimated that battery-operated electric clock sales will top 3 million units this year, compared to about 750,000 three years ago.

"THERE'S GOLD in them thar hills," according to the Department of Interior. Total employment is at the highest level in America's history and the unemployment rate dropped from 4 per cent in mid-June to 3.9 per cent in mid-July, the Labor Department notes.

Desalination—converting salt water into fresh water—is becoming big business.

John G. Seiler, president of the Tube Turns division of Chemetron Corp., said that in the past decade some 4,000 desalting units have gone into operation, producing a total of 36 million gallons per day of fresh water.

"Furthermore," Seiler noted, "forecasts indicate that by 1985 the nation's desalination plants will be producing 20 billion gallons a day."

BIG SPENDING in the area of salt water conversion by government and private industry opens up a fertile field for leading fittings suppliers, and Mr. Seiler said, Chemetron's Tube Turns division is ready to meet this challenge.

"We have a program to educate our field personnel in this area and have channeled engineering efforts into development of specialized products for the desalination industry," Mr. Seiler concluded.
