Williams Defends FBI Reports On California Crime Statistics

Spencer Williams, GOP nominee for Attorney General, today vigorously defended Ronald Reagan's contentions regarding FBI criminal statistics in pointing out the seriousness of California's crime problem.

"Brown appointee, Richard M. McGee, is doing a great disservice to law enforcement when he belittles the accuracy of FBI crime reports in a desperate effort to distract the people's attention from the administration's pathetic record in law enforcement," Williams said.

"I am alarmed," Williams said, "that an otherwise responsible public official, also interested in greater law enforcement, would add his detractors, for the sole purpose of trying to conceal many shortcomings of the

Brown-Lynch administration in law enforcement."

"Our own State Department of Justice figures show that the number of major crimes per 100,000 persons has gone up 148 per cent under the indifferent administration of the Brown-Mosk-Lynch regime," Williams said. He asserted that although minor discrepancies are bound to develop in any system which compiles reports from more than 8,000 separate agencies representing 92 per cent of the nation's population, that the FBI has established excellent reporting standards and carefully audits all reports to establish maximum reliability.

"Such minor deficiencies cannot be used to explain away major facts; for example: the FBI reports show that while California's population exceeds New York's by 3 1/2 per cent, our crime rate exceeds New York's by 70 per cent. The administration has not been above using FBI reports when it seemed to favor California — namely to show how our percentage increase in crimes of violence was less than that in other enumerated states," Williams said.
