Brummel to Direct 'Yes On Proposition 3' Drive

Stanley M. Brummel, member of the Los Angeles City Parks and Recreation Commission and the Los Angeles Coliseum Commission, has been appointed Harbor Area Chairman for the "Yes on Proposition 3" campaign sponsored by Californians for Open Space Conservation and Recreation. Yes on Proposition 3 already has been endorsed by the California State Democratic Central Committee, the California AFL-CIO, the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union, the League of California Cities, and State Soil Conservation Commission, the California Farm Bureau, the Conservation Law Society of America, the Sierra Club, and other major recreation, conservation, business and community groups. Brummel's appointment was announced by Arthur Freed, Southern California Chairman for Yes on Proposition 3. "Yes on Proposition 3 will direct the State Legislature to eliminate the out-moded assessment laws which are hindering the preservation of California's precious open space lands which are needed for recreation, conservation and the production of economical and nutritious food supplies close to the major centers of population," Brummel said in urging all Harbor residents to vote Yes on Proposition 3.
