## Father Percy to Begin Sermon Series Sunday

The Rev. Hugh R. Percy, Rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, will begin a series of sermons Sunday under the general title, "Challenge and Re-Assurance."

## \$3 Million Pledged by Executives

Pledges totaling nearly \$3 million have been received from some 150 business firms, according to Arthur M. Wood, vice president of Sears, Roebuck and Co. and presiding campaign chairman of the United Crusade.

Wood said executives attending a "pacesetter" luncheon have pledged \$2,829,929 toward the \$21,750,000 goal.

Louis Lundborg, United Way president and chairman of the board of the Bank of America, told the executives that "every unmet need compounds itself" in urging the group to increase their support of the United Crusade drive.

The United Crusade, a partnership appeal of the United Way and the American Red Cross, gets underway Sept. 29 and is due to end Nov. 22.

# Government Officials, Clergymen Set Meeting

Los Angeles County Government will be host to the National Association of Evangelicals for a day-long seminar next Monday.

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn is serving as coordinator of the program, which will bring together ministers and church lay leaders from throughout the county.

THE NATIONAL Association of Evangelicals is headquartered in Wheaton, Ill., and will hold its 25th annual convention in Los Angeles next April.

Hahn will open Monday's program at the Hall of Administration, 500 W. Temple St., at 9:15 a.m. with a talk entitled "Administering the Largest County in the World."

Other presentations will be made by the Los Angeles County Human Relations Commission, Inspector James Fisk of the Los Angeles Police Department, and representatives of the courts.

"AT NO TIME in history has there been a greater need for high morals and ethics in government," Hahn said. "The challenges facing Los Angeles County can be met with the help of the clergy and their congregations."

Early last June, Hahn sponsored the first "Convocation of the Clergy" in county history, bringing together church leaders of all faiths for a meeting at the Hall of Administration to discuss the problems of racial tension and community unrest.

More than 500 persons attended that conference.
