
The event will begin at 1 p.m., according to Harold Packard, junior past commander and chairman of the event.



Some important words on a serious subject

I hope you never receive a malicious phone call, but if you do, here are some things you can do to discourage the caller:

Hang Up—if the caller doesn't answer when you say "hello."

Hang Up—at the first obscene word or improper personal question.
