**Peninsula High Rise Plan Vetoed by Board**

Supervisor Burton W. Chace has won approval of a plan to keep high-rise off the Portuguese Bend section of the Palos Verdes Peninsula.

The proposal, which also limits population density, was passed by the Board of Supervisors on Chace's motion Tuesday.

"My proposal supports the position of the people of the Palos Verdes Peninsula," Supervisor Chace said. "Through letters and personal contact, they have made their wishes to preserve the rural atmosphere of the Peninsula known to me and I concur."

CHACE'S resolution amends a Regional Planning Commission decision on a zone exception and a zone variance for 108 acres of land. The property is south of Palos Verdes Drive South, between Forrestal Drive and Palos Verdes Drive East.

Owners of the land, Palos Verdes Properties, Inc., sought zone changes which would have permitted unlimited high-rise and as many as 43 dwelling units per acre.

Under Chace's proposal, the area's height limit will not exceed 80 feet above the finished grade of the hillside. This ruling becomes effective

with Tuesday's Board approval.

A SECOND portion of Chace's actions regarding the area stipulates that maximum density of the area will not exceed 25 dwelling units per net acre. This proposal goes back to the Regional Planning Commission with the recommendation of the Board of Supervisors.

The commission will review the proposed change and resubmit its findings to the Board for final approval.

"While my proposals insure the residents that their rural atmosphere and ocean view will be preserved, they also allow the property owner to develop his land in a reasonable and profitable manner," Chace said.

The controversial zoning matter had been under study since 1965. In March of 1966, the Regional Planning Commission approved zoning changes which allowed 11-story high-rise and high-density up to 50 units per acre.
