Drama Heading For ECC Stage

"Look Homeward, Angel," Pulitzer prize-winning Broadway play, will be presented in the Campus Theater of El Camino College Oct. 28, 29, and Nov. 4 and 5.

Based on Thomas Wolfe's novel of the same name, the production will be presented by the theater arts department and will be under the direction of William Buck, drama instructor. Curtain time will be 8:30 p.m.

"Look Homeward, Angel" received the Pulitzer Prize in 1958 as well as the New York Critics Award for the same year. Advance sale of tickets will begin Oct. 24, in the college bookstore. Admission will be \$1.50. Student tickets are 75 cents. Tickets will also be sold as available at the box office on the nights of performance.

THE ENSUING flight, fancies, and fights of Amanda and Elyot and the persuing chase, chagrin, and chaos of Sibly and Victor meet head-on in the closing scene with all four love principals having breakfast in Amanda's Paris flat.

The beautifully gowned Miss Killingsworth is utterly captivating as Amanda, the double-petaled flower of guile and innocence. Her first appearance with the Players last year in "Auntie Mame" brought her the best-actress-of-the-year award. Long active in the Long Beach Civic Light Opera, her most recent appearance was as Queen Guenevere in "Camelot."

Four time best-actor-award-winner, Cloyd is ideally cast as the urbane Elyot who cavorts from ardor to anger with daring footwork, (and occasionally backwork, when his "Mandy" pushes him over the couch). He has appeared as leading man in some 20 Playhouse productions, including the recent "Holiday for Lovers."

CHARMING AND effective as the plaintive bride of an evening, Miss Parvaresh is working on a masters degree at California State College at Long Beach.

Goodman, whose credits include Beau in the Playhouse's "Auntie Mame," is particularly convincing and likeable in the third act when he attempts the impossible — to fathom Amanda's true feelings. He also has appeared in "Kismet" and "South Pacific."

Credit for Louise, the French maid, goes to Joe Maes Knoerr, who fusses very effectively over the flat's condition following the battles of the evening. Miss Knoerr, long a Playhouse member, was last seen in "The Women."

"Private Lives," which is being presented Thursdays through Saturdays at the Playhouse, will close Oct. 22. Reservations are available at the box office.
