

## Nurses Conference to Hear Dr. Stainbrook

Dr. Edward Stainbrook, Ph.D., M.D., will address the Catholic nurses of Southern California at the Seventh Annual Fall Conference of the Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Nurses to be held Oct. 15 at St. Joseph College, Orange.

Dr. Stainbrook is Professor and Chairman, Dept. of Psychiatry at the University of Southern California and is Chief of the Psychiatric section of Los Angeles General Hospital. He is also Chairman of Training Committees, National Institute of Health and a Member of the Council of the American Psychiatric Association.

A graduate of Duke University, Dr. Stainbrook was formerly a Director of the Yale University Psychiatric Clinic and Hospital and an Associate Professor of Psychiatry at the Yale University School of Medicine. He also served as Professor and Chairman of the Dept. of

Psychiatry at the State University of New York. Dr. Stainbrook will speak on the subject, "Interrelationships Between Doctor, Nurse and Patient."

The Conference will be a one-day meeting starting at 8:15 a.m. and continuing until 4 p.m., said Mrs. Ronald Rowley of Anaheim, the general chairman of the Conference.

There will be guest speakers from the Torrance League of Women Voters.


