Missionaries to Lead Services Here Sunday

The Rev. and Mrs. Thomas Tipton, who began a year's leave of absence from the East African mission fields in July, will conduct the morning and evening worship services in the new sanctuary of the Narbonne Avenue Baptist Church Sunday, according to the Rev. Levi Price, pastor.

The missionary couple has been serving in Tanzania and Kenya since 1959, and will begin a three-year tour of work in Uganda next July.

BOTH ARE graduates of Georgetown College in Kentucky where he took his degree in Bible and speech and she in English and music.

During his work in the mission fields, the Rev. Mr. Tipton has helped with church development, community center work, and education. He was headmaster of the Baptist High School in Mombasa with about 130 students.

During his tour as headmaster with the school, the Rev. Mr. Tipton worked to

complete the chapel-office building, taught chemistry and choir, looked after 40 boarding students, and prepared the first senior class for final examinations.

MRS. TIPTON taught English and organized the extracurricular activities for the students at the Mombasa schools. She plays the piano and vibratory and he plays the piano and marimba.

The Tiptons will make the visit Sunday a personal one as well, according to the Rev. Mr. Price. Mrs. Tipton's father, Ezra Dixon Jr., is a member of the Narbonne Avenue Baptist Church, and has been its custodian since 1962.


