

# Garden Checklist

1. Remove faded blooms from roses and other blooming plants. This will encourage more blossoms.
2. Remove the canes of blackberries and raspberries that bore fruit this year, then tie the newly grown canes to the trellis for next year's harvest.
3. Daffodils often bloom better if they are lifted from the soil and given a month or two of rest in a cool garage. Divide them only if they are literally falling apart in your hands.
4. The prize chrysanthemums come from plants that have been regularly fed and watered. Feeding should continue until the buds show color.
5. Remove side buds from dahlias if you would have show-quality blooms.
