New Mortuary Reflects A Mediterranean Style

The new structure, designed by Rolly Andrew, A.I.A., surrounds the present administration building where business is being conducted "as usual." When completed, the Mediterranean style building will have additional offices as well as facilities for memorial services.

THE BUILDING has specially designed traffic-flow areas to allow several completely private services to be conducted at one time.

Also under construction

the south of the main building is the Green Hills Memorial Chapel.

B. T. Kenney, general manager, announced this week that the latest addition to the expanding facilities at Green Hills will be "The Cloisters," a new mausoleum.

THE 1800-CRYPT mausoleum will be built on a site at the park overlooking Los Angeles Harbor. The Cloisters properties are now being offered on a pre-development program, Kenney said.

Seminar Set for Teachers

A past president of the National Science Teachers Association will appear in Torrance Tuesday, Oct. 25, at an in-service training meeting scheduled for Torrance teachers.

Addressing elementary teachers and high school science faculty members at Torrance High School at 3:45 p.m. will be Dr. Glenn Blough, professor of education at the University of Maryland and author of 30 books for teachers and children.

A graduate of the University of Michigan, Dr. Blough has studied at the University of Chicago and at Teachers College, Columbia University. He has taught in elementary school, junior and senior high school, and in colleges and universities. He has served on the faculties of the State College of Education at Greeley, Colo., and the University of Chicago.

IN 1950 he was awarded an honorary doctor's degree by Central Michigan College of Education for distinguished contributions in the field of education.

For eight years he served as specialist in science in the United States Office of Education.

Students at the University of Maryland presented Dr. Blough with the Diamond Award for achievement and service in 1958.

HE IS PAST president of both the National Science Teachers Association and the National Council on Elementary Science.

Six of the 30 books he has authored have been chosen for distribution by the Junior Literary Guild Book Club.

Among the books he has written are: "Monkey With a Notion," "Beno the Mayor," "The Tree on the Road to Turntown," "Wait for the Sunshine," "Not Only for Ducks," "Looking for The Ducks," "Lookout for The Forest," "When You Go to The Zoo," "After the Sun Goes Down," "Who Lives in This House," and "Young Peoples Book of Science."
