Contract for Pool Awarded At Victoria

A swimming pool and dressing rooms at Victoria Regional Park, 190th Street and Avalon, will soon be under construction, reports Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

E. A. Weitzel and Associates, Inc., has been awarded the contract to build the pool and other facilities, which are expected to be completed and ready for use by next summer.

The contract, for \$379,500, will be financed from State-wide Beach and Park Bond Issue funds approved by the voters in 1964.

Plans call for an Olympic-size pool, a wading pool, and a building with dressing, showering, and locker rooms.






Cost of bottle warming cut 34%
