

Growth Is Key Factor in El Camino Tax Measure

Editor's Note: The following article was prepared by Dr. Stuart E. Marsee, president of El Camino College, to present a clear picture of financial problems which lie behind the request for a continuation of the special 20-cent override tax. The measure appears on next Tuesday's ballot as Proposition U. El Camino College is observing its 20th anniversary during the current college year.

Having established a phenomenal growth record during its first 20 years, El Camino College must continue to grow with local demands and population. Enrollment at El Camino College has increased by 3,462 students during the past five years and will continue at approximately the same rate. The most conservative forecasts for the future emphatically reveal that the present enrollment of 15,600 will grow to 22,500 by 1975.

To accommodate this continued registration increase, the college must continue a long-range expansion program. To do this, money must be available to build more classrooms and other facilities, provide instructors for

an expanding enrollment, add new programs — particularly in the technical arts, business and health occupation fields. Provision also must be made for additional counseling, parking, equipment and operations pending approval of the tax continuance.

Trends for the future in education are very real for El Camino College. They follow:

- Increasing numbers of California pre-professional students are completing their lower division study in the junior colleges, leaving resources, faculty and facilities of universities and colleges for advanced study.
- As the functions and importance of the junior college increase, with a widening diversity of program and broader and higher enrollment, it will become increasingly important and difficult to keep the quality of equipment, planning, and teaching at the highest standard.
- Junior college facilities, due to the appetite of the American people for learning, will increasingly be used for longer portions of the day.
- The changes brought by the industrial revolution, followed by the atomic age with wide applications of automa-

tion and technology, have forced changes in our industrial, social, and political life. These changes were made possible largely by education and have resulted in a need for more learning in a spiraling progression. With the acceptance of the necessity, and the inevitability of increasing need for education, comes the challenge of how good it shall be and how fast shall it be developed.

- As enrollments increase and costs mount, more attention will be given to developing new methods and techniques of teaching in an effort to expand effectiveness of instruction and to increase the efficiency of curriculum development.
- The role of student personnel practices will become increasingly important in the educational scene.
- The population explosion and new technology will continue to place demands on the college to provide more facilities and educational services. Planning for expansion and new curricula must be continuous and long-range.

Thus, with the ever-increasing emphasis placed upon the value of college education, the role of El Camino College will continue in its

Plans for Road Work Approved

Plans for the improvement of a 1.5-mile section of Lomita Boulevard in the Carson area have been approved by the Board of Supervisors, Chairman Burton W. Chace has announced.

Bids for the project will be opened by the board Nov. 22 and a construction contract awarded about 10 days later. Work is scheduled to be completed in August, 1967.

Work involves the widening of Lomita Boulevard between Normandie Avenue and Main Street to provide a four-lane, curbed, and divided highway in a 100-foot right-of-way.

Traffic control signals at the intersections with Normandie, Vermont, and Wilmington avenues and Figueroa Street will be improved.
