Board Ends Limits on Structures

Height limit restrictions on reinforced concrete buildings have been removed from the County Building Code by the Board of Supervisors.

Board Chairman Burton W. Chace said the action sets aside the previous limit of 13 stories or 160 feet for concrete structures.

The action was taken on recommendation of County Engineers.

THE COMMITTEE, Chace pointed out, also seeks adoption of the new code by the City of Los Angeles and the Los Angeles Chapter of the League of California Cities.

"In doing away with specific height limits," Chace explained, "the amendment provides for additional safety standards which must be observed in design and construction of such buildings."

THE NEW code, is based on design improvements which make it possible for reinforcing steel in concrete buildings to stretch and compress without danger to the structure.

"As a result, tall concrete buildings designed under the new standards will have sufficient strength and ductility to ride out severe earthquakes," Chace added.

Psychiatrist to Talk To Torrance Teachers

An internationally renowned psychiatrist who has been a disciple of Alfred Adler since 1923 will speak to Torrance teachers at an in-service training session Thursday, Nov. 17. The 3:45 p.m. institute will be conducted at Torrance High School auditorium.

Viennese-born Dr. Rudolph Dreikurs, whose work has been lauded in Brazil, the United States, and Austria, will discuss the topic "Encouraging Children to Learn."

A 1923 graduate of the University of Vienna, Dr. Dreikurs practiced medicine and organized mental hygiene

clinics in Austria before coming to this country in 1937. During the 14 years he practiced in Austria, he directed clinics for child guidance, alcoholics, and psychopaths.

FOUNDER of the Alfred Adler Institutes in Chicago, Ill., and Tel Aviv, Israel, and the Child Guidance Centers in Chicago, Dr. Dreikurs has held the post of professor at the Chicago Medical School since 1942.

In addition, he has served as visiting professor at the University of Rio de Janeiro, Northwestern University School of Education, at the

University of Oregon, Indiana University's Gary extension, at Loyola University, and at Roosevelt University.

A FELLOW in the American Psychiatric Association, he has held the offices of president of the American Society of Group Therapy and Psychodrama, president of the American Society of Adlerian Psychology, vice chairman of the International Association of Individual Psychology, vice president of the American Humanist Association, president of the Illinois Society for Personality Study, and honorary president of the

Sociedade de Psicologia Individual of Rio de Janeiro. Books he has authored include: "The Challenge of Marriage," "The Challenge of Parenthood," "Character Education and Spiritual Values in an Anxious Age," "Fundamentals of Adlerian Psychology," "Psychology in the Classroom," and "Encouraging Children to Learn; the Encouragement Process."
