

IRS Planning To Hire 300 New Workers

Some 300 temporary workers will be hired by the Los Angeles Internal Revenue Service office to assist in processing of federal income tax returns during the 1967 filing period.

Robert A. Riddell, IRS district director, said that hiring will begin in January and may continue through April or May. An hourly rate of \$1.74 will be paid for full or part-time work.

No experience is necessary, Riddell said, but applicants must pass a written test covering clerical abilities and aptitudes. Applications must be filed not later than Jan. 31, 1967, with the Board of U.S. Civil Service Examiners, Internal Revenue Service, 870 Market St., San Francisco 94102.

Tests will be given in Los Angeles and Long Beach. Information is available at local post offices and IRS district offices.

Pre-Teens Will Form New Club

Report on Alcoholism Published

A report to the community on "Alcoholism—Everybody's Problem" has been issued by the Board of Supervisors, Chairman Burton W. Chace has announced.

The report is a 24-page, illustrated booklet describing the disease, its characteristics, and methods of prevention.

Published by the Board of Supervisors in cooperation with the County Commission on Alcoholism and the County Health department, the booklet was prepared for distribution by civic, parent, and social groups.

THE BOARD of Supervisors has authorized publication of 50,000 copies in English and 25,000 in Spanish.

"More than 360,000 people in Los Angeles County are in some stage of alcoholism," Chace said. "This means that 8 1/2 per cent of all county residents over the age of 20 have a drinking problem."

"This large total means that alcoholism rates as one of the county's most serious health, social and police problems," Chace said.

RESIDENTS OF Chace's Fourth Supervisorial District who have drinking problems may be treated at two clinics.

They are the Alcoholic Los Angeles County Health Department Clinic, 111 E. First St., Room G28, and the Long Beach Health Department Clinic, 2655 Pine Ave., Long Beach.

"This illustrated report will go a long way in advising the victims of alcoholism of the steps he can take toward rehabilitation," Chace said.

Supervisor Chace has three appointees working on the County Commission on Alcoholism. They are Dr. Donald E. Timmons of Long Beach, Courtney Anderson of Los Angeles, and Brigadier Cyril Clitheroe of the Salvation Army.

Questions on Federal Aid

Six questions on issues of general public interest are to be included in the current newsletter from Congressman Alphonzo Bell to be distributed soon, he reported this week.

- Do you believe Russia can be instrumental in arranging negotiations with North Viet Nam?
- Do you feel temporary suspension of industry expansion tax incentive will help combat inflation?


