

El Camino Ends Season Against Long Beach Vikes

That old talk about the football season ending just when things are going good is true in the case of Long Beach City College. The Vikings, winners of their last three games, entertain El Camino Saturday evening in Veterans Stadium in the Metro Conference final.

The Warriors host a 3-2-1 Metropolitan Conference record while LBCC is 3-3. El Camino is 5-2-1 for the overall season and Long Beach 5-3. Coach Paul Chafe and his

Long Beach crew must stop the vaunted Warrior passing game of quarterbacks Bob Quarry and Dana Clyde.

Quarry has completed 59 of 141 passes for 1,012 yards and eight touchdowns. His chief receiver is Dave MacGillivray, who does everything but take tickets at the turnstile. The speedy sophomore began the year as No. 1 running back but was moved to flanker three games ago.

To date MacGillivray has snared 38 passes for 675 yards and six TDs. The slippery letterman will be tough to locate when play begins, sometimes lining up at flanker and split end in addition to his old left halfback slot. But MacGillivray is the key to the Warrior offense. Where he goes, the ball goes.

Warrior fullback Randy Smyth is suffering from a slight charleyhorse but will play. The 185-pound sprinter ranks fifth in Metro scoring 48 points and fourth in rushing (399 yards). Halfback Steve Schmitz stands seventh in points (36) and 14th in yardage (245).

Long Beach will be coming off a 39-17 win over Rio Hondo that featured a tremendous second-half comeback. The Vikes rolled up 442 yards total offense, 193 of that on a grinding second-half ground game. Fullback John Kafka led the Norsemen with 97 yards, Dennis Parks totaled 70, Al Nichols 50 and Brent Gilman 30.

Quarterback Bob Stewart completed 12 of 22 passes for 153 yards and one touchdown. Flanker Jim Cross caught 9 for 121 yards.

Bakersfield's Leroy Sledge slashed the El Camino defense for 106 yards on 13 carries and scored three touchdowns to pace the Renegades to a 26-12 victory. Randy Smyth tallied twice for

the Warriors from short yardage.

The conference championship, national prestige, and possible bowl bids are at stake for Santa Monica and Bakersfield in the last round of Metropolitan Conference football games this weekend.

Santa Monica (6-0-0 in conference and 7-0-1 overall) has already clinched at least a tie for the Metro crown, but Bakersfield (5-1-0 and 7-1-0) still has a mathematical chance to gain a share of the title.

Santa Monica ends its regular season schedule Friday night as host to East Los Angeles. Bakersfield entertains Cerritos Saturday night.

In last week's clashes, Santa Monica fell behind, 24-6, and then roared back for a 52-27 victory over Valley.

Sensational John Erdhaus dominated Valley by firing six touchdown passes and scoring two other touchdowns on a 14-yard run and a 22-yard return with an intercepted pass.

A record entry of 333 drivers has been recorded for the American Road Race of Champions, sports car racing's world series at Riverside International Raceway, Nov. 23-27.

The whopping field is by far the largest recorded for the ARRC since its inception three years ago and probably is the biggest field of drivers ever assembled anywhere for a major road race.

Jr. Rose Bowl Choices Near

This is the week of decision for the Junior Rose Bowl Game. Eleven men—six administrators for the California Junior College Athletic Association and five men from the sponsoring Pasadena Junior Chamber of Commerce—will meet Sunday at the Huntington-Sheraton Hotel to choose teams to play in the 21st Annual Game, Saturday, Dec. 10.

But before the selection there remains some unfinished business. All but one of the prominent teams in the running has a game remaining Friday or Saturday.

From California the contenders are San Francisco (8-0), Pasadena (7-0-1), Santa Monica (7-0-1), Fullerton (7-1), and Laney (8-0). On the other side are Boise (9-0), and two Texas teams, Kilgore (8-1) and Henderson (9-1). Only Henderson, last year's Eastern representative, has completed its schedule.

San Francisco, with its fabulous O. J. Simpson (1,167 yards in 138 carries, 22 touchdowns, closes out Friday against weak (3-5) San Jose. Pasadena's Western State Conference champions have an even easier patsy Friday afternoon at Compton (7-1). Santa Monica will have its usual easy Friday night against East Los Angeles (1-6-1). Fullerton, last year's JRB champions, has been improving with every outing and the Hornets may need it against fast-finishing San Bernardino (6-2) Saturday night. Laney, which probably won't warrant too much consideration since the California JC Athletic Association has ruled its conference, the Coast, is of a "minor league" variety, plays the toughest task ahead for the JRB contenders faces once-beaten Taft, Saturday night. Taft lost its first game, 27-14, to Arizona Western last week.

Kilgore travels to Marion, Alabama.

El Camino Wrestlers To Perform

Three-time state wrestling champion El Camino College is prepared to defend its title.

Last season Coach Dave Hergsteller's grapplers overpowered Bakersfield, 78-62, to take the state championship for the third consecutive time.

Seven grapplers from last season return. Six of them lettered. Lettermen are Curt Alder (152), Gary DeBeasubian (145), Glenn Enfle (187), Dan Guevara (115), Dave Patterson (160), and Steve Warren (137).

Both Engle and Guevara captured thirds in state finals. Alder also gained state honors, taking a fourth in the 152 division.

Prep prospects include Larry Lear (160 of Lennox) and Bob Urhausen (115) of Redondo, CIF title-holder Jim Kauble (160) of South Torrance gained 2nd place honors in All-Bay League while attending high school.

Other prep prospects include Dan Acosta (180) of Mira Costa, Steve Evens (160) of New Jersey and Peter Moore (115) of El Segundo.
