Struzel intercepted two passes for two defensive stars to total 7 for the year and a new record. Jim Fiege caught one of the tie old record of 6. Other six star men to tie the record are Dennis Trani and Pete Taulog. Also intercepting for the Seahawks were Lloyd Walter for 18 yards and Gipson for 12 yards returns.

Thom Williams threw 14 passes for 142 yards and three touchdowns to give him the all time high record of 17 TD passes for the season. Eric Wheeler did an outstanding job at defensive end as he stopped the Pierce offense with five unassisted and 19 assisted tackles.

Pasadena, Henderson Picked for Junior Rose Bowl

Hometown Pasadena City College will meet Henderson County Junior College of Athens, Texas, in the 21st Annual Jr. Rose Bowl Game on Saturday, Dec. 10.

Pasadena, with an 8-win 0-loss 1-tie record, was chosen after spirited voting over Santa Monica and City College of San Francisco.

Both Pasadena and Henderson will be making their second appearance in the Junior Rose Bowl. In 1951 the PCC team last season, had an even more spectacular record than


