WILSON TOLD councilmen the M-2 zone provides more flexibility for development of his property than does the more restrictive M-1 zone.

Industrial firms are coming to Torrance from other cities and from county areas to escape the light manufacturing zones, Wilson said.

He then asked that any further study of his part of the 100-acre parcel be halted. Councilmen unanimously voted to rescind the order for the study on motion of H. Ted Olson.

Plans for Sepulveda Approved

Torrance councilmen last night earmarked \$40,000 in gas tax funds for major improvements to Sepulveda Boulevard and Arlington Avenue.

Rights of way for the project recently were acquired by the city. Walter M. Nollac, director of public works, said.

The project calls for the widening of Sepulveda Boulevard between Arlington Avenue and Cabrillo Avenue and the installation of curbs, gutters, and sidewalks, Nollac said.

In addition, Arlington Avenue will be improved between Sepulveda and 230th Street.

IN OTHER action last night, the council:

- Adopted, on first reading, an ordinance rezoning property at 190th Street and Hawthorne Boulevard from M-1, C-2, and P-3 to C-3. The parcel, located at the northeast corner of the intersection, is to be developed by Ronald E. Moran.
- Re-enacted an ordinance which prohibits the construction or demolition of buildings within the Meadow Park Urban Redevelopment area. The construction moratorium, which has been in effect for nearly two years, was extended for an additional six months by last night's action.
- Approved a lease agreement with the Torrance National Little League and the Torrance Babe Ruth League for fields now located at Cabrillo Avenue and Plaza del Amo. The agreement extends leases previously held by the two groups.

"TOO MANY potential leaders expend all their efforts and concerns on their own personal goals rather than sharing a portion of their talent with their city, state, and nation and their fellow man," he stated.

The trick, he said, is to "help him recognize that the benefits from working for society can often produce very personal benefits too."
