Meeting on Alcoholism Scheduled in December

A luncheon to acquaint newly elected State Assemblymen and Senators with the urgency of alcoholic rehabilitation legislation is being scheduled by county supervisors, Chairman Burton W. Chace said today.

The Board yesterday approved the action and asked that the luncheon be scheduled early in December.

"We want to acquaint the legislators with the immediate need to continue funds for alcoholic rehabilitation," Chace said. "Early action is needed when the Legislature convenes in January if the current program is to be continued."

Funds provided by the McAtter - Rumford - Rumford-Marks Alcoholism Act will run out before the 1967-68 budget is approved, according to Dr. Nicholas J. Khoury, chairman of the county Commission on Alcoholism. Unless emergency legislation is effected, the program will die.

The state program provides operating funds for alcoholism rehabilitation centers in Long Beach and Los Angeles. "Our county Commission on Alcoholism fully supports the proposed legislation," Chace said. "The commission will coordinate the luncheon for the legislators."

Rogers Family Tradition Kept Alive with Reunion

When the Rogers family gets together they have to rent a hall.

And, that's exactly what they did on Thanksgiving day as they met for the 60th consecutive year — this time at the new Torrance YMCA building at 2900 W. Sepulveda Blvd. It was the family's first visit as a group to Torrance.

All descendants of Temperance Sarah Ann Rogers, who crossed the plains in a wagon train just after the Civil War, this year's gathering was attended by 130 members of the family, according to Mrs. John W. Richmond Sr., Torrance resident and granddaughter of the pioneer Mrs. Rogers.
