Hearing on Dump Plans Scheduled

Plans for a privately operated rubbish dump in the Watteria area will be aired at a hearing before the City Council at 8 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 10. Councilmen are scheduled to hold a public hearing on the petition to establish the dump in a sand and gravel pit south of Pacific Coast Highway and west of Crenshaw Boulevard.

The city's Planning Commission has recommended that the petition be denied. Residents of the Watteria area have opposed the petition on grounds that it would decrease property values and create health and safety hazards. Attorneys for Charles Praty, who would operate the dump if it is approved, first asked that the hearing before the council be delayed until February.
