New Observatory Show Will Open on Tuesday

The traditional Christmas season astronomy show "Christmas Stars" bows in at Griffith Park Observatory's planetarium theater next Tuesday. Dr. Clarence H. Clemminshaw explains it might have been a comet, a nova or a conjunction of planets. "Christmas Stars" will be presented through January 1 during the balance of this year. Starting the first of next year, a new scale of admission fees will go into effect.

According to Dr. Clarence H. Clemminshaw, director of the Los Angeles City Recreation and Parks Department scientific center, the holiday presentation will be offered daily except Monday at 3 and 8:30 p.m., with extra matinees on Saturdays and Sundays and New Year's Eve at 1:30 and 4:30 p.m. The observatory will be closed Dec. 24 and 25, Dr. Clemminshaw said.

UNIQUE FEATURE of the show will be the recreation of the sky as it was 2,000 years ago over Bethlehem. In the darkened sky the planets are seen in their relative positions, the Southern Cross appears above the horizons of the city, and the North Star is about 10 degrees away from the north celestial pole. Recreations of the heavens in their historical appearance is accomplished by means of the ingenious giant Zeiss projector at the observatory.

A NUMBER of theories which might explain the appearance of the bright star over the ancient city are offered during the show.


