Mail for Servicemen Now Sent Overseas on Airlift

Postmaster Carl L. Backlund of Torrance today announced that henceforth all first class mail, personal sound recordings (voice letters), and parcels weighing 5 pounds or less and measuring not more than 60 inches in length and girth combined,

will be airlifted on a space available basis between the United States and all military post offices overseas.

Also, under the Dulski Military Mail Act — which was signed by President Johnson on Nov. 2 — second class publications such as newspapers and magazines published weekly or more often, and featuring current news of interest to the military, will be airlifted from San Francisco to the armed forces in Viet Nam.

Postmaster Backlund, also reminded mailers that Christmas airmail should be sent no later than December 10.

Pitchess also announced a reorganization of his department. Under the new organi-

zation, James F. Downey, assistant sheriff, will be responsible for activities of the patrol, administrative, and technical services divisions and the Office of Business Management.

McCloud, as undersheriff, will be responsible for the detective, jail, corrections, and civil divisions, Pitchess said.
