Christmas Plays Set At College

"Electra," "Fumed Oak," and "The Stronger," three one-act plays, will be presented by the Division of Fine Arts in the recital hall of the Music building today and Thursday at 8 p.m. 8 p.m.

Under the direction of Peter Henderson, the plays are a part of the El Camino College eighth annual Christmas Festival of Arts.

"Electra," originally written by Sophocles, the Greek dramatist, was adapted by Henderson for this program. The play is an original verse and deals with the murder of Aegisthus and Clytemnestra by Electra and Orestes. The cast includes Virginia Traynor as Electra, Danny Acosta as Endocles, and William Ennis as Orestes.

Also included in the cast are William Snare as Pedagogus, Marvin Wilson as Pylades, Mark Croneberg as Aegisthus, Sharon Mathis as Clytemnestra. The part of Pitheas will be played by Larry Felix; Debra Shemaker will play the part of the Chorus and John Bingham will play the Guard.

The second play, "The Stronger" is a 10-minute one-act by August Strindberg. Three characters comprise the casting for this play.

Linda St. Marie will play the part of Miss Y; Carolyn Eubanks will play the part of Miss X and Larry Felix will portray the Waiter. This play deals with female psychology.

"Fumed Oak" by Noel Coward is the third play of the evening. The cast for this comedy will feature Natasha Gadbois as Mrs. Rocket, Sandy Fredericks as Elsie, Melodie England as Doris Gow, and William Snare as Henry Gow. This play is approximately 30 minutes in length.

Hahn Asks State Funds For Welfare Work Plan

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn today called for renewed support of a county-operated work and training program which he said has saved taxpayers more than \$1 million a month by cutting down the charity rolls.

Hahn urged Gov.-elect Ronald Reagan and the 1967 State Legislature to provide state funds for the program, which was, until recently, providing 7,500 welfare recipients with training for productive jobs.

The program was cut, Hahn said, when state and federal money was withdrawn.

CURRENTLY there are approximately 4,500 persons enrolled in the training program at 350 separate locations. Their training involves doing productive work for governmental agencies as clerical, maintenance, and mechanical helpers.

A total of 24,553 men and

women have received training in this program since it began in February, 1964, and 16,881 have been placed in jobs, Hahn said.

An additional 9,015 have been removed from the welfare rolls because they refused to accept training. This cutting back on the welfare rolls has resulted in taxpayers' savings of more than \$1 million a month, he pointed out.

HAHN SAID the success of the training is further shown by the fact that at least 80 per cent of the recipients who were placed in jobs were still self-supporting after a period of six months, and approximately 90 per cent who had been placed had not reapplied for welfare by the end of the year.

"With proper training and motivation, thousands of families can be removed from the welfare rolls and be made self-supporting, building pride and accomplishment and savings for the taxpayers," Hahn said.

He has termed the cutback of funds from the federal and state governments as "penny wise and pound foolish" and asked that the legislature take steps to provide \$3 million next year so the program can continue.
