Party Set For Area Youngsters

Some 50,000 underprivileged children will be guests Sunday at special "Cry for Help" Christmas party at the East Los Angeles College stadium.

The party is the result of a project begun 14 years ago by Robert Lee Smith, Smith, with the help of industry and entertainment leaders, religious groups, the Los Angeles Board of Education, and the Armed Services, held the first party in 1952.

Recipients that year were children of servicemen then serving in Korea, but each year since 1952, Smith and the Cry for Help Foundation have distributed toys and gifts to some one million underprivileged youngsters.

TOYS WERE donated by leading manufacturers and stored at a headquarters building provided by Equity Funding Corp. of America.

Sailors from the Long Beach Naval Station worked to put the headquarters building into shape.

Among those appearing at the party will be former Governor Goodwin J. Knight, former Los Angeles Sheriff Eugene Biscailuz, actress Ann Blyth, and actor Harry Von Zell. All were guests at the first party in 1952.

Utility Employees Report High 'Fair Share' Marks

Sign-ups for contributions to the AID-United Givers 1966-67 campaign were received from 86.5 per cent of the employees in the gas company's Southwest division, according to division manager S. W. Lynch.

Through the annual campaign, employees signing up pledge 12-or-more-minutes-of-a week to the "fair share" plan of supporting community health and welfare causes.

In this year's effort, employee sign-ups throughout the gas company's system—which stretches from Visalia in the north to El Centro in the south—reached 88.3 per cent or 4,579 employees out of 5,189 eligible who are contributing. Of this group, 74 per cent are on a continuing basis from year to year.
