Publication of two volumes in the series "Language in Our Life," co-authored and edited by Dean Marvin Laser of California State College at Dominguez Hills, was announced today by Harper and Row, publishers.

The books, according to the publisher, are for use in high school English classes. Volumes 3 and 4 are scheduled for publication in 1967, according to the publishers.

Dr. Laser, dean of the School of Humanities and Fine Arts, was appointed to his position last spring. He joined the Dominguez Hills faculty after serving at Cal State-Los Angeles.

He has contributed numerous books and articles on American literature and criticism and authored a number of textbooks now being used in high school and college English classes.

The building will contain 10 classrooms, including two kindergarten classrooms. Plans must be completed within 45 days.


The new building is part of a \$1 million school construction program approved this week by the Board of Education of the Los Angeles City Schools.
