

EC Student Body Officer To Join 'Up With People'

Tim Scott, El Camino College's commissioner of assemblies, will join "Up With People" in early February. As a branch of the Moral Re-organization, "Up With People" attempts to get people to combat the apathetic feelings and tendencies of not only the younger generation but the nation and the world as well, Scott explained. To awaken people to its ideals, the Moral Re-organization sponsors three Sing-Out casts and the

publication of "Pace" magazine, a monthly periodical which stresses the fast pace of the world today by accentuating the positive aspects of national events. everyone else everywhere," he continued.

THE SING-OUTS, composed of groups of high school and college students, represent young America's bid to involve an entire generation in building a more compatible world, Scott noted. The musical variety shows, directed by British producer Henry Cass, answers invitations from military bases and cities across the U.S. and Canada. Requests have also come from Europe, Latin America, the Caribbean and Southeast Asia.

"I have been on a personal moral re-organization drive for about five years but I didn't see anything happening to me or my friends, so I decided to join 'Up With People,'" Scott stated. "I hope to be a part of the moral revolution in which everyone will love

"AS I SEE IT, the Moral Re-organization program is analogous to the sailor who checks his course by the North Star," Scott said. "Participants view absolute moral standards as the sailor does the star; they never expect to reach it yet always keep trying," he elaborated.

Scott, as well as being in charge of assemblies at the college this semester, is an active member of the Newman Club and one of the sponsors of Synanon's organization of non-addicts formed to raise funds for the corporation.

Photos of Christmas On Display

Volunteers Near Goal, Wood Says

United Crusade volunteers inched toward an all-time high goal of \$21,750,000 today as a 98.2 per cent total was reported during a campaign cabinet meeting in Los Angeles.

Arthur M. Wood, presiding campaign chairman, said the \$20,926,393 raised to date "represents a great deal of hard work. There is a conviction on everyone's part that this goal is obtainable."

Wood, western regional vice president of Sears, Roebuck and Co., is scheduled to leave in mid-January for Chicago where he will become Sears' mid-West vice president. He told volunteers he hopes to celebrate victory in the crusade before he must leave Los Angeles.

Two areas have exceeded their goal, he reported. They are Antelope Valley (118.6 per cent) and Pomona Valley (101.7 per cent).

The harbor area quota is 84.1 per cent complete, Wood said. A total of \$218,664 of the \$260,000 goal has been raised. Virtually all areas have reached the 80 per cent mark.

"There are so many depending on what we do," Wood said, "because United Crusade supports 244 United Way services and 11 chapters of the American Red Cross."

Auto Firm To Sponsor Scholarship

A \$500 scholarship for the study of auto mechanics has been established in the Torrance schools by Ve's Ford Sales Co. of Torrance. The grant, which will go to a graduating senior from one of the city's four high schools, is for expenses at a technical school.

Award of the scholarship will be made for the first time in June, according to Vei Miletich, president of the firm.
