## Recipients Of Welfare Find Jobs

"Operation Paycheck," a joint endeavor to secure employment for public assistance recipients, has resulted in the placement of 5,674 workers in the past three months, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn said today.

The project was sponsored jointly by the County Department of Public Social Services and the California Department of Employment.

It involved extensive counseling by personnel of both departments during the months of April, May and June, 1967, to help persons get off welfare.

"ESTIMATED taxpayer savings is \$1,058,427, and this is a conservative estimate," Hahn said.

Hahn pointed out that since the advent of "Operation Paycheck" in April, there has been a 68 per cent increase in the number of recipients who secured employment over the months of January, February, and March.

The supervisor has directed Ellis P. Murphy, director of the Department of Public Social Services, to continue the aspects of the pilot program which proved particularly successful.
