Harbor JC Plans Class For Medical Secretaries

A medical secretarial procedures course is being offered mornings at 10 at Harbor College during the fall semester. Enrollment is open to students who have typing and shorthand skills, according to Mrs. Leila R. Smith, instructor.

Completion of training will qualify the student for a position in the personally rewarding and fast-growing medical secretarial profession.

The course will include many aspects of work in a medical office. Students will take dictation and transcribe medical records and case histories. The vocabulary used

in specialties such as pediatrics, obstetrics, gynecology, mental health, and cardiology will be taught.

Training in medical office procedures will include such topics as receptionist and telephone techniques; the business and legal aspects of medical practice; billing and collections; and financial records. Medicare, workmen's compensation, and other health insurance plans will be discussed. Students will be instructed in preparing required forms and records. Class enrollment is limited to 40.

The last day to file an application for admission for the fall semester is Aug. 30. Registration is now in process through Sept. 8.

Fishermen Begin Fiesta Planning

The 1967 Fishermen's Fiesta, the city of Los Angeles' annual salute to its' multi-million dollar commercial fishing industry, will be held for three days Oct. 13, 14 and 15, in San Pedro.

The three-day week end celebration is an outgrowth of the fishing community's traditional giving of thanks during the slack period between the summer and winter fishing seasons.

Dating back to antiquity, it is a time to express heartfelt appreciation for Big Money catches already delivered to the canneries, and to ask the Lord's blessing for good fishing and good luck on the voyages to come.

ACCORDING to Joseph Mondt, president and general chairman of the 1967 fiesta, some 2,000 fishermen and their families in the San Pedro area and adjacent com-

munities are expected to participate in this year's three-day spectacular, which is a major holiday on the calendar of the fishing community in Southern California.

The funfest normally attracts upwards of 250,000 visitors for the nautical atmosphere of carnival — including street bands, street dancing, folk dancing exhibitions by Yugoslavians, Filipino, Scandinavian, Italian, Japanese and Spanish-descended fisherfolk, and the grand parade of lavishly decorated fishing boats on Oct. 15, the final day of the fiesta.

NINE SKIPPERS already have signed up for the boat-decorating competition and more are expected.

The vessels and their owners' captains are the Frankie Boy No. 11, Frank Iacono; Lucie Ann, Antonio Pisano; the San Antonio, Anthony Di-

Leva; the Progress, Frank Foretich; the St. Jude, John Pisano; Mercator, Jack Russo; the San Pedro Boy, Andrew Tipich; the St. Christina, Tony DiLeva; and the Ralphie Boy.

As with all past Fishermen's Fiestas, this year's celebration will be ruled by its own queen, The Skipperette, to be chosen at a special beauty contest scheduled for early October.

A PANEL of judges, prominent in the entertainment industry, will select the winner. The Ladies Auxiliary of the Fishermen's Cooperative in San Pedro is in charge of the Skipperette contest.

With the Fiesta only 2½ months away, organization of this year's event is being speeded up by Bill Harris, long-time member of the Fiesta Committee and chairman of the booth rentals.

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
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
