Cobalt Bomb Scheduled For Gardena

Equipment for one of the largest and most modern radiological and X-ray departments in the country is currently being installed in Memorial Hospital of Gardena, scheduled to open this fall.

The department is part of the \$13 million Memorial Hospital project, scheduled to receive its first patients in October. Combined with its sister facility, Memorial Hospital of Southern California in Culver City, the two hospitals have the largest number of beds of any proprietary facility in the country, according to David M. Brotman, M.D., president of the board of the two hospitals.

The radiological department will feature some of the most advanced diagnostic and treatment equipment, including cobalt therapy equipment, often called the "Cobalt Bomb." The Siemens equipment which will be used at the Memorial Hospital of Gardena, is one of only a handful of such in use in this country. It is capable of handling up to 5,000 curies of radioactive Cobalt 60, reports Samuel S. Steinberg, M.D., director of nuclear medicine in Culver City, and co-chairman of the new unit in Gardena.

The new unit will be staffed by Dr. Steinberg and radiologist James G. Conti Jr., Samuel S. Steinberg, Alfred R. Conti, and Henry J. Le Bost, all medical doctors.
