

Legion 9 Beaten By Ontario, 6-5

Amateur baseball is a popular sport in Torrance. The latest to make headlines is the South Torrance American Legion team sponsored by Bert S. Crossland Post 170.

Not until South was beaten by Phoenix, Arizona, 2-0, and Ontario, 6-5, was there doubt the local Legion team was one of the best in the country.

The end of the line for 1967 came, however, when Torrance blew a 5-3 lead in the ninth inning against host Ontario Friday. Ron Rude stroked a two-run single off Dick Foulk to tie the game and winning pitcher Terry Tuley scored the winning run on an overthrow.

South had a 5-0 lead in the third inning, but Ontario got three in the bottom of the inning. The game continued scoreless until the bottom of the ninth.

In the second round of the tournament Phoenix pitcher Jim Wilson outduelled Bart Johnson, 6 hits to 3, and won the game on a 2-run fourth inning.

Bill Burns singled with the bases loaded and Larry Anderson walked to force in the second run.

The heat played havoc with most teams in the tournament. Johnson was unable to overpower the hitters and came away without a strike-out. He walked two.

Johnson, Steve Shrader, and Steve Trudell got South's only three hits in the game.

American Legion baseball has become increasingly popular in the Torrance area. For the first time this summer four teams were fielded, representing primarily North High, West High, Bishop Montgomery, and the combined Torrance-South High.

Coach Jerry McIvaine of South High will have 12 members of the Legion squad with him during next spring's high school baseball campaign, and 13 of the 15 Legion players are eligible next year. Dan Pace, second baseman

for South High during the prep campaign, pitched the final four innings in a 4-1 win over Las Cruces, New Mexico, Wednesday.

Pace relieved Dick Foulk in the sixth inning with his team ahead, 4-1. Dan allowed three hits, walked none, and struck out six men.

Foulk gave up five hits in the five innings he worked. Coach Jerry McIvaine was pleased with Pace's performance. "I have been searching for a fourth pitcher," the coach said.

Bart Johnson and Charley Schindler are the other two relievers.

Against Los Cruces, South Torrance collected 10 hits. Johnson and Steve Trudell both got two hits.

Centennial Football Tilt To Be on TV


