177 Days Of Class Scheduled

Between Wednesday, Sept. 13, and Friday, June 14, Torrance students will attend 177 days of class.

Teachers will begin the new year two days earlier, reporting to work Monday, Sept. 11, to set up their rooms and attend orientation sessions.

The only school holiday which falls on a Saturday this year is Veteran's Day, Nov. 11.

Holidays to be observed include: Thanksgiving, Thursday and Friday, Nov. 23 and 24; Christmas, Monday, Dec. 18 through Monday, Jan. 1; Lincoln's birthday, Monday,

Feb. 12; Washington's birthday, Thursday, Feb. 22; Easter, Monday, April 8 through Friday, April 12; and Memorial Day, Thursday, May 30.

Parent conferences will take place from Monday, Nov. 13, through Tuesday, Nov. 28, and from Monday, March 25 through Friday, April 5.

First semester classes will end Friday, Jan. 26.

High school graduation exercises are set for Wednesday, June 12, and eighth grade commencement for Thursday, June 13. Summer school session is planned for Thursday, June 20 through Wednesday, July 31.

Monday, Sept. 11, marks the return of students to Chadwick School, in Rolling Hills, according to school officials. A 5 per cent increase in day student enrollment is anticipated for the 1967-68 school year.

Spaghetti with meat sauce will be the featured item on elementary school lunches. Rounding out the first day's meal will be buttered spinach, peach and cottage cheese salad, mixed fruit with marshmallows, French bread and butter, and milk.

Tacos will be served Thursday, while oven browned fish sticks will be Friday's main dish. Lunch cost will remain 40 cents.

High school cafeterias will offer a plate lunch at 40 cents and a variety of hot and cold sandwiches, soup, salads, desserts, and beverages at a la carte prices.

Elementary school plate lunches are planned to meet national "type A" diet requirements, Blandy said.


