

International Holidays Theme for Annual Event

"International Holidays" has been chosen as the theme for the 1967 Fishermen's Fiesta, scheduled for San Pedro Oct. 13 through Oct. 15. The announcement was made by Joseph Monti, Fishermen Fiesta president, who added that this year's spectacle would be climaxed by the parade of fishing vessels, each decorated to carry out the international theme.

Fishermen's Fiesta is an outgrowth of the fishing community's traditional giving of thanks during the slack period between the summer tuna run and the winter fishing. The Blessing of the Fleet is one of the highlights of the Fiesta. The three-day weekend funfest also includes a colorful midway with decorated booths serving "international" foods and many fish dishes. Street dances are nightly events and special entertain-

Medical Program Adds New Classes at Camino

El Camino College is expanding its medical assistant training this fall to include three areas — full-time, part-time, and brushup courses for young men and women who desire specialized preparation for employment in medical offices and clinics, according to Carl Meadows, dean of the Division of Natural Sciences.

The program, which follows recommendations of an advisory committee of representatives from the medical professions and practicing medical assistants in the South Bay, is aimed at training students in the three basic areas of medical secretary, office nursing, and routine laboratory techniques.

Prerequisites for the course are high school biology, or Zoology 2 or permission of the medical assistant counselor plus the ability to type a minimum of 40 words per minute.

STUDENTS may attend El Camino with the goal of earning an associate in arts degree at the college.

THOSE WHO wish only to earn their medical assistant certificates without the A.A. degree may enroll on a part-time basis and complete the requirements within a year.

Two class of one semester each may be taken by currently employed medical assistants or those medical assistants with prior experience who wish to brush up on their training or to upgrade their knowledge.
