

Harbor College to Honor Two With Friends Medals

Two community leaders will be honored at the third annual Convocation of Los Angeles Harbor College Friday at 9:30 a.m. in the men's gymnasium.

Joseph N. Marino, an alumnus of the college, and Marvin J. Dunne, as a civic leader, will receive medals designating them as Friends of the College in the first formal ceremony of the new school year.

Marino, who is principal of 223rd Street School, was elected student body vice president in the first student election held after the college opened its door in September, 1949. In 1950 he was elected student body president.

Receiving his associate in arts degree from Harbor in 1951, he earned his bachelor's degree from Long Beach State in 1953 and his master's degree from the University of Southern California in 1960.

He has taught at Leland Street, Crestwood Street, and White Point Schools as well as serving as vice principal of Gulf Avenue and Towne Avenue Schools.

Active in community affairs, Marino is a past president of the San Pedro Toastmasters Club, assistant coordinator of Project Headstart,

vice president of the Harbor Welfare Conference, and chairman of the Operations Committee of the Wilmington Coordinating Council.

DUNNE, PRIOR to his retirement in June, worked for 30 years for the California Department of Employment in

eight offices in Los Angeles County. He was manager of the Wilmington Office for 17 years and during World War II worked closely with labor and management in the shipbuilding industry. He was also chairman of the local War Manpower Commission during that time.

For five years before his

retirement he was Operations Supervisor of the Long Beach Employment Service Office in charge of placement activities in San Pedro and Wilmington. He was also in charge of the Manpower Development and Training Program, which used the College facilities for some of its programs. He is a resident of Long Beach.

New student body officers will also be introduced by student body president Clark Aristel. Dr. Wendell C. Black, president of the College, will deliver the principal address, "No One But You."

THE MEDALS will be presented by Van Guelder Waring, president of the Faculty Senate, and Lorenz Mundstock, president of the Faculty Association.

Music for the program which will start with an academic procession will be provided by the combined 72nd U.S. Army Band under the direction of CWO W. A. Thompson and the Harbor College Band under the direction of Daniel R. Remeta. Colors will be presented by the Color Guard from Fort MacArthur. The college's A Capella Choir under the direction of Robert Billings, also will sing.

The invocation will be delivered by The Rt. Rev. Magr. George M. Scott of Mary Star of the Sea Church in San Pedro. The benediction will be delivered by The Rev. Kenneth Reeves of St. Peter's by the Sea in Portuguese Bend.

Shorthand Class Set For Adults

A course will be offered this fall by the Torrance Evening High School for women who have good typing skills but lack shorthand skills, according to Raymond Collins, principal of the adult school.

The class will meet Tuesdays and Thursdays at North High School. The three-hour sessions will begin at 6:45 p.m.

Persons who enroll Sept. 19 for the class should be ready for employment by Jan. 1, Collins said.

THE STENOGRAPH class is designed to teach students the ABC and phonetic abbreviations of stenography and should provide students with a proficiency of 80 to 80 words per minute.

In addition, Collins said, students will learn letters in high frequency words, techniques of taking dictation, spelling, punctuation, capitalization, and construction.

COLLINS SAID persons who have unsuccessfully attempted symbol shorthand or those who believe it too difficult will especially profit from the class.

Enrollment will be accepted in the classroom Sept. 19. North High School is located at 3620 W. 182nd St.
