(Continued from page one) Cristobal Dominguez, a nephew of Juan Jose, received title in 1809. Spanish rule in California gave way to Mexican in 1822, and Cristobal Dominguez' title was confirmed that year by the Governor of Mexico.

THE PROPERTY passed to Manuel Dominguez, oldest son of Christofal. When the widow of Manuel Dominguez died, she left the property to her six children. The portion of the Dominguez' holdings on which the Financial Center is located was given to Susana Dominguez. Upon the marriage to Susana and the payment of \$1, Gregorio del Amo y Gonzalez received full title to the divided interest of Del Amo Estate Co. in 1899.

The property was purchased by the developers from the Del Amo Estate Co. in 1964.

Del Amo Properties Co., the present owner, is a joint venture of Great Lakes Properties, Inc., of Los Angeles, and Guilford Glazer & Associates of Beverly Hills.

GREAT LAKES Carbon, one of the nation's largest privately-held manufacturing companies, diversified into real estate in 1953 when it purchased 6,800 acres on the Palos Verdes Peninsula. A partnership, Palos Verdes Properties, was formed with Transamerica development Co. to master plan and market the Peninsula land. The result has been the creation of one of the choicest residential areas in Southern California.

Other projects of Great Lakes include Rancho Camarillo, a 4,700-acre planned community in Ventura County where major roads and sewers are now being installed to prepare land for sale to builders later this year; Villamora, a 4,000-acre resort and retirement center on the south coast of Portugal; a condominium apartment program near Seville, Spain, and a franchise agreement with Holiday Inns, Inc., to build and operate approximately 10 motels in the west. The company's first Holiday Inn opened in June at Richmond, Calif.

GREAT LAKES Properties and Guilford Glazer & Associates are also associated on "The City," a project similar in scope to Del Amo Center to be built on 180 acres in Orange County.

In addition to the Financial Center, Del Amo Properties Co. owns property on both sides of Hawthorne Boulevard between Torrance and Sepulveda boulevards which has been master-planned for high-rise apartments, hotel, restaurants, theaters, a heliport and retail stores.

(Continued from page one) REDONDO Beach police have issued a warrant for Blackburn's arrest in connection with a market robbery June 30 in which \$22,000 was taken.

He was arraigned Friday in Milwaukee on the fugitive warrant issued in connection with the Redondo Beach charge. Extradition proceedings will be started at once and Blackburn reportedly has indicated he will fight the extradition process.

OFFICER Seibert was killed during the course of a robbery Aug. 10 which netted some \$15,000 for the bandit. The officer was fatally wounded when the gunman shot him three times as he entered the market at Crenshaw and Artesia boulevards. O'Brien reportedly was identified from police mug files as the gunman. He was being sought under a warrant issued by the South Bay Municipal Court. Utah authorities took him into custody following the Aug. 25 auto crash.
