

Child Welfare Officials Commend City Authorities

Two child welfare and attendance officials from the Torrance Unified School District spoke Monday before the luncheon meeting of the Torrance Safety Council, commending local fire and police authorities for their outstanding cooperation in making Torrance a safe place for school children.

Paul Mackey, child welfare and attendance consultant, noted that the question of where to place street-crossing guards, for instance, was always carefully studied by both the school and police officials.

Mackey also noted that police worked closely with the schools in determining the safest routes for children walking to school. Safety route maps, he added, are now being prepared for distribution to all children in kindergarten through first grade.

THE SCHOOL welfare consultant also thanked the city for help in seeing that all road safety signs and street markings near schools are maintained regularly.

As a sidelight, Mackey recommended two films on drugs for all high school students, PTA members, and interested citizens. One of the films, "LSD: Insight or Insanity?"

will be shown next Monday at the Educational Council of Torrance luncheon at the Torrance Recreation Center. The other film is entitled, "Pit of Despair."

Mackey's assistant, Robert J. Ellsworth, gave a brief roundup of health and safety on school grounds and in the classrooms. He noted that a new system of filling IBM accident cards for each on-campus incident had been adopted by the Torrance Unified School District.

THE IBM system showed that out of 34,000 students enrolled last year, 6 per cent had been involved in accidents, half of which could be termed minor bumps or scrapes.

Some schools, he said, had observed that the greatest number of accidents occurred between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. and that between those hours, the greatest number occurred in the last 15 minutes. Schools have cut their accident rates by shortening this noon hour.

ELLSWORTH stated that safety and first aid instruction were given in the classroom beginning with kindergartners. Fire drills, he added, are routinely practiced

Veterans Qualify For Loans

More than 140,000 veterans, program include those who served at least 181 continuous days in the Armed Forces, VA-guaranteed home loans totalling almost \$2.3 million under the G.I. Bill which became effective in March, 1966, according to Mort Webster, manager of VA's Southern California regional office.

An additional 7,695 have obtained direct loans from the Veterans Administration amounting to \$92,488,000. All figures are through July 1967.

The 1966 law permits the Veterans Administration to guarantee up to \$7,500, or 50 per cent, of loans which eligible veterans may obtain from private lenders. The guarantee in many cases makes it possible for veterans to obtain home loans with low down payment — or no down payment at all.

VA ALSO makes direct loans to veterans in certain isolated and rural areas where private lending facilities are not available. Under 1967 legislation, which became effective Oct. 1 the limit was extended from \$17,500 to \$25,000.

Veterans planning to buy a home may obtain additional information and certificates of eligibility from any Veterans Administration regional office.
