Multiply six times eleven and carry six. Give the other side 14 and you have a football score of 72-14. That little beauty belongs to West High, the suburb of Gardena, which got even with El Segundo for a lot of little things over the years Friday night.

Cougars Upset South

South dropped out of first place in the Bay League as the Hawthorne Cougars overran the Spartans, 26-13, on the winners field Friday night. The Cougars threw a fierce rushing attack at South.

Halfbacks Gary Bearid and Buddy Swinford led the main attack, with Bearid rushing 53-yards in nine carries, while Swinford sprinted 34-yards in eight tries, in the first quarter.

Swinford scored twice in the first period for Hawthorne on 2 and 5-yard runs. The Cougars continued their tight ball control throughout the first half. South had only five plays in the first quarter.

A Jeff Wang fumble in the first quarter hampered the team. Wang, who surged to a CIF record with 349 yards against North last week, was bottled up until the fourth quarter when he ran 54 and 73 yards to touchdowns.

Hawthorne increased its 13-0 halftime lead to 19-0 in the third period. Wang combined with Mike Hernandez for most of South's late punch. Dan Pace, South's other half was injured late in the second quarter, and was out for the game with a sore right knee.

In his first run Wang shook off four tackles for the Spartans first score. Less than five minutes later the senior half-back broke loose for another big score.

North Beats Santa Monica

North High scored the first three times it got the football and rolled to a 26-7 win over Santa Monica Friday. It was the first time in history the Saxons beat Santa Monica in a varsity football game. North (2-0-1) has the inside track to the Bay League title following South's 26-13 loss to Hawthorne.

The hero of the homecoming victory was Rick Creighton who ran 43 and 69 yards for two of North's touchdowns in the first quarter. After a 20-7 first period score, Santa Monica came within a 1 yard line fumble of getting back into the game in the third quarter. A second Samohi fumble with 10 minutes to go in the game was the final turning point. North went on to score its fourth TD and put the victory in the ice box.

SANTA MONICA kicked out of bounds to open the game and the ball was put in play on the North 40. Five plays later Creighton streaked off tackle on a quick for a 43 yard touchdown run. Santa Monica returned the ensuing kickoff almost to midfield, but on the first scrimmage play Guy Sutryk picked off a pass interception to put the Saxons in gear at the Samo 35 yard line.

Dan Hansen threw to Tim Dillard for 16 yards and Creighton went 15 more to the 4. From there Hansen scored on a rollout. North led 14-0, with 4:26 gone in the game and John Pattison was 2-for-2 with the conversions.

After Santa Monica drove to the North 34 yard line, Sutryk got his second pass interception.

Wrong Handoff Beats Torrance

Rolling Hills beat Torrance, 20-6, in a game of dull football Friday afternoon. The victorious Titans played their fourth straight home game and they appeared tired from the monotony. The lackluster performance by Rolling Hills was a signal for Torrance to pull an upset, but with the score 6-6 in the fourth quarter, Tartar Quarterback Dennis Watkins had a handoff stolen by Brian Butler and he ran 51 yards for a victory touchdown.

In the final minute of the game, John Papadakis ran 49 yards for Rolling Hills' third touchdown. An interception led to a first quarter touchdown for Rolling Hills. Torrance tied the game in the third period after a drive of 70 yards. The teams spent the first seven minutes getting acquainted. The first sign of uneasiness was a penalty that put the Tartars on their back porch late in the first period. Watkins went back to pass and in the final minute of the game, Mike McGuire in the corner of the end zone. Rolling Hills then went from its own 20 to the Torrance 10 where the next most flagrant penalty occurred and time ran out on the Titans. Torrance scored in the third quarter on a 70 yard drive. The key play was an 18-yard pass from Watkins to McGuire to the 2 yard line. Mike Van Kralingen carried it over. Torrance was building momentum and heading for the winning touchdown to start the fourth quarter when Butler grabbed a Torrance handoff and ran the distance, 51 yards. Although the Torrance offense was sluggish, some of the defensive men were superb. John Large was outstanding at left tackle. Terry Waters also had a particularly good afternoon. He had been injured in recent games.
