

Poverty Project Plans Open House

Visitors will have a chance to see the inner workings of Project Head Start this Friday when the administrative offices at 750 N. Broad Ave., Wilmington, hold an open house from 1 to 4 p.m. Project Head Start is the only main poverty program whose headquarters are located in the Harbor area.

Clifford Hutter III, project director, and his staff have extended an invitation to the community to drop by and get a close-up view of the project's work in breaking the poverty cycle.

"So much misunderstanding of poverty programs will be cleared up through talking with the heads of our various services," Hutter said.

A guided tour has been planned for the public. Guests will see the book and record library and the Cheer Center where food and clothing are distributed to needy families.

Project Head Start provides classroom training for four and 5-year-olds who might otherwise be academically handicapped when they enter the first grade.


