

Solons Ask Moratorium On Camper Parking Law

SACRAMENTO—The State Assembly, with no debate, has given final passage to what may be the major piece of legislation to come out of the current special session of the legislature.

The Assembly approved SCR1 by Senator Randolph Collier (D-Yreka), which asks the California Highway Patrol and local law enforcement agencies to observe a 120-day moratorium on enforcing a new law regarding parking of pickup-campers, house trailers and housecars.

Collier had authored SB632 during the 1967 session which

prohibits parking such vehicles on any streets or highways during the hours of darkness. While the same language had been in the law in a different code section, the bill caused considerable furor in the past few weeks. It was scheduled to take effect last Wednesday.

Collier's resolution was presented in the Assembly by Assemblyman John F. Foran (D-San Francisco), chairman of the committee on transportation and commerce. Assembly Speaker Pro Tem Carlos Bee (D-Hayward), who main-

while presiding over the lower house, announced that Foran had 10,000 copies of the resolution printed so legislations could send copies to their constituents.

This was in reference to the fact that most legislators have received more mail, telegrams, telephone call, and personal contacts on the camper and trailer bill than on any other measure, including the reapportionment of congressional districts, which is the main subject before the legislature at its special session.

Concurrent resolutions, such

as SCR1, have no binding effect on either state or local agencies but are intended to express the legislature's intent. Collier said, if the 120-day moratorium is granted, remedial legislation can be enacted to correct the law in early 1968.

Garden Checklist

1. November is the best month to plant tulips in California. Set them 2 to 3 inches deeper than recommended in most bulb charts.
2. Various cool weather annuals can be set out now — calendula, viola, pansy, baby primrose, Iceland Poppy.
3. Shop nurseries now for bright spots of foliage and other indications of the autumn season.
4. Ranunculus may be set out either as bulbs or as seedlings from nursery flats. They bloom and bloom in spring.
5. Try to finish all spring bulb planting this month.


