

State Still Borrowing Despite New Tax Plan

SACRAMENTO — The state's first required prepayment of the income taxes due from higher bracket Californians resulted in a 29.7 per cent jump in revenues to the state's general fund for the first four months of the 1967-68 fiscal year.

However, State Controller Houston I. Flournoy reported that general fund income for the July-October period still fell \$235 million behind expenditures. Revenues totaled \$734.6 million, while expenses were up 9.2 per cent to a total of \$969.8 million.

AS A RESULT, the general fund had to borrow another \$13.5 million during October to keep the bills paid. The general fund now is in debt by \$214.5 million since July 1, plus another \$194 million in debts carried over from the previous fiscal year. The total indebtedness was \$408.5 million. The tax increases voted by the legislature were expected to repay this by the end of the fiscal year next June 30.

Personal income taxes for the first four months totaled \$71,059,702 million, an increase of \$5,551,655, or 264 per cent, from a year ago. Persons who paid \$200 or more in taxes for 1966 were required to pay half the amount of their 1966 tax as a prepayment on 1967 taxes by Oct. 31.

THE FRANCHISE TAX Board received prepayments from 330,000 of the 370,000 persons who were notified of the payment that was due. But much of this was not received until Oct. 31 and will show up on future reports.

Major income for the July-October period included sales tax, \$350 million; bank and corporation franchise and income taxes, \$114.8 million; cigarette tax, \$50.2 million; and liquor, \$28.9 million. Major expenses were: school apportionments, \$318.7 million; University of California, \$55.6 million; old age security, \$42.4 million; and to families with dependent children, \$44.2 million; bond interest and redemption, \$79.2 million; and health care benefits (Medi-Cal) \$76.8 million.

Veterans of Vietnam Can Convert Insurance Plans

Veterans of Vietnam and all servicemen recently separated from active duty are reminded by Mort Webster, manager of the Los Angeles Veterans Administration regional office, of the right to apply for an individual life insurance policy within 120 days after separation from service.

More than 99 per cent of the servicemen participate in the Servicemen's Group Life Insurance program and are eligible to convert to private insurance when they are discharged, Webster added. Veterans are covered by the group policy for 120 days after separation, without further payment of premiums.

Boy Finds Dad's Body In Bedroom

A retired grocery clerk apparently took his own life Wednesday afternoon by shooting himself through the head. Dead is John Donald Duffy, 62, of 23835 Ward St., whose body was discovered by his son, Michael Duffy, in the bedroom of their home.

During the 120-day post-separation period, any insured veterans may apply for an individual life insurance policy from any of the 540 participating insurance companies without taking a physical examination, the manager explained.

Because they are no longer paying premiums many returning veterans forget about their life insurance and fail to apply for individual insurance policies until after the 120-day period has expired, Webster said.

Auto Crashes Into Walkway; Injures Youth

A Torrance youth suffered deep cuts about the head and neck Wednesday night when he was thrown through the windshield of a car.

Taken to Little Company of Mary Hospital by ambulance was Rodney Hill, 18, of 3837 W. 229th St.

At the wheel of the car was Jack Cunningham, 19, of 2616 Graham, Redondo Beach. Cunningham told police he lost control of the automobile and slammed into a walkway at the corner of Sepulveda and Ocean Avenue.

Firm to Redeem Debentures Soon

Bernard Levine, chairman of the board and president of Vernitron Corp., announced today that the company will call for redemption of its 8 1/2 per cent convertible subordinated debentures due July 15, 1961, during the week of Sept. 26.
