

Books Are the Perfect Gifts

Of all the gifts you might offer a child this year, books are among the best. As the book becomes a long-term favorite, this Christmas and your thoughtfulness will be pleasantly stamped in the child's memory.

When selecting a gift book, keep in mind three criteria. First, is it a book that the child will want to own both now and in the future? Second, is it the best version of that particular book and with the best possible illustrations? Finally, is it either superbly up to date or a timeless classic?

A child under three, according to educators and child care experts, will relate most easily to animal books with bright, simple pictures. He'll certainly like "Ring o' Roses" a collection of Mother Goose rhymes and "A Apple Pie," Kate Greenaway's colored ABC book. For the

slightly older pre-schooler, you might pick "The Tale of Peter Rabbit" or "The Golden Goose Book" which tells of The Three Bears, The Three Little Pigs and Tom Thumb.

THE CHILD of five to seven is learning to read, and can appreciate the stories of the brothers Grimm, A. A. Milne's "Winnie the Pooh" and "Alice's Adventures in Wonderland." As he advances slightly in age and reading ability, he'll want to tackle "Gulliver's Travels," "Aesop's Fables," "Uncle Remus" and the wonderful animal stories

compiled by Hugh Lotting into "The Story of Doctor Do-little."

Around ten, the tastes of boys and girls begin to differ. Either can enjoy "The Merry Adventures of Robin Hood" or "The Story of King Arthur and His Knights." But whereas girls lean toward "Little Women" and "Rebecca of Sunnybrook Farm," boys usually prefer tall tales about cowboys like "Pecos Bill," or adventure stories such as Stevenson's "Kidnapped" or Cooper's "The Last of the Mohicans."

TEENAGERS vary from

those who read anything to those who loathe most books. still good choices; they'll be kept and used for years. You might consider the collected works of William Shakespeare, "Moby Dick" or "Les Miserables."

If the teen you're buying for has a hobby, however, your best bet is a book about it. Look up the hobby in Major Reference Works supplement at the back of the "Random House Dictionary of the English Language." Every field of interest from ancient history to stamp collecting is listed, and the reference books suggested are the best ones available.
