## Presented in Annual Christmas Concert

Strains of the old, beloved Christmas carols will mingle with American folk melodies and calypso tunes when the Las Vecinas Women's Chorus weaves "The Spell of Christmas" in song at the Redondo Women's Club, 400 South Broadway, Redondo Beach, on Friday evening, Dec. 15 at 8 p.m.

Directed by Mrs. E. R. Harvey and accompanied on the piano by Mrs. Robert Padelford, the chorus will offer lighter selections by Roy Anderson, Harry Simeone, Meredith Wilson and others, including the perennial favorites, "Winter Wonderland" and "Sleigh Ride." Together with a men's chorus from neighboring church choirs, they will relate the simple Christmas joys depicted in American folk songs like "I Wonder As I Wander" (arr. Neil) and "The Spell of Christmas" (arr. Follett). Among additional selections, "Calypso Noel" (Krunnusz) and "Sleep, Little Tiny King" (Besig) characterize the Caribbean Christmas spirit, while the Ukrainian "Carol of the Bells" (arr. Wilhousky) adds an international folk flavor.

The primary work to be performed is "The Song of Christmas." Composed by Roy Ringwald and arranged by Fred Waring, it tells the nativity story in songs, carols and Biblical verses. Soloists will be Mrs. Ansel Ball, soprano; Mrs. M. Douglas Hyde, soprano; Mrs. John Kinzie, soprano; Mrs. Robert Padelford, soprano; and Paul Thompson, baritone.

A special interlude will feature Paul Thompson and the Children's Chorus, also directed by Mrs. Harvey. They will present "Trim Up the Christmas Tree" from the children's story, "How the Grinch Stole Christmas" by Dr. Seuss.

Following the program, refreshments will be served, including the traditional Las Vecinas wassail bowl for adults and punchbowl for children. There is no admission charge.
