

Named to Commission

The appointment of Mrs. Marie Shibuya of Rolling Hills Estates to the County Commission on Human Relations has been announced by Supervisor Burton W. Chace. Mrs. Shibuya, a member of the 1966 Grand Jury, replaces Ed Talbert, Torrance insurance executive, who resigned. "Mrs. Shibuya performed well during her term on the Grand Jury," Chace said. "I am certain she will serve with credit and distinction on this important commission."

The appointee, a resident of 38 Rollingwood Drive, will serve the remainder of a term which expires July 1, 1969.

The 25-member Commission on Human Relations engages in research and education aimed at lessening racial and religious tension and developing attitudes of better understanding.

The commission develops and administers human rela-

tions programs and coordinates the work of community agencies involved in this field.

Each member of the Board of Supervisors appoints five members to the commission for three-year terms.
