

Newsman Joins Faculty Of Area Adult School

Veteran newsman Jack Jones will teach a course in "Writing for Publication" at the Banning Adult School in Wilmington during the spring semester, Arthur McIntyre, principal, said today.

Jones has been on the staff of the Los Angeles Times for the past 12 years. He is the author of "The View from Watts" series which explored the problems of Los Angeles negroes and which was singled out by the judges in awarding the Times the 1965 Pulitzer Prize.

He also is the author of one novel and several published short stories. The class will meet each Tuesday from 7 until 9:30 p.m. at Narbonne High School.
