

Sign-Up Time Keeps Little League Occupied

The youth baseball program, which caters to 3,000 Little Leaguers in Torrance during the spring and summer months, is now soliciting league applications. Leagues which have submitted notices of registration for this week are herein listed.

Riviera LL
Registration for Riviera Little League will be Saturday at Wilson Field, 23701 Ocean Ave., Torrance, from 9 a.m. to noon. A second date is Monday from 7 to 9 p.m. at Riviera School, 365 Paseo de Arena.

League president Al Jicha said each boy participating in the league will play two innings and have a time at bat in each game. To register, proof of birth and parental approval are required at the time of registration.

Southwood LL
The home of players agent Bob Thurston, 21922 Grant Ave., is the site of registration this week for the Southwood Little League. Hours are 7-9 p.m. daily and 9-11 a.m. on Saturday.

Boys born between August 1, 1954, and July 31, 1959, are eligible. League President John Enfield said a \$10 voluntary donation is solicited to help defray the costs of building a new playing facility. Boys who become 8 years old prior to Aug. 1 and who will not be 13 prior to Aug. 1 are eligible for the year.


Tordondo LL

Registration for Torrance American Little League will be Saturday from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Seaside Field, located at Sharynne Lane and Doris Way in Torrance.

All boys who plan to participate this year must be registered. A parent or guardian must accompany the boy to registration with proof of age (birth certificate or certified copy), and be available to sign the application authorizing the boy's participation. Boys 8 to 12 born on or after August 1, 1954 and on or before July 31, 1959 are eligible to play this year. A donation of \$10 per family at time of registration will be appreciated to help defray the cost of operation expenses.

For parents unable to attend the daytime sign-up, registrations will be taken on the same date at 5220 Clear-site or 4721 Macafee between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. Information can be obtained by calling 378-1912. Tryouts will be Feb. 11, 18, and 25 at Seaside Field. Boys who were not assigned to a major team last year must participate in at least two tryouts. Method of Stocking NBA Teams Told

NBA Commissioner Walter Kennedy disclosed the method for stocking the newly franchised Association teams, Seattle and San Diego. A professional and college player draft is scheduled for the first week of May. Each of the two new clubs will draft 15 players, three from each of the existing 10 NBA teams, for a total of 30 players. Each of the ten NBA teams will be allowed to protect seven players and no more than three may be chosen from one club. A flip of the coin will determine which of new cities gets first choice in the professional draft.

After the first player has been selected from each of the 10 clubs, each club has

the right to protect one of its remaining players in the pool. In the 1967 draft of college players, Seattle and San Diego will draft sixth and seventh following the lowest five teams in consolidated percentage standing at the conclusion of the current season. The loser between the two teams involved in the professional draft flip will get first choice (sixth) in the college selections. The next 10 picks will be made by the 10 existing NBA teams, the team with the sixth lowest consolidated percentage standing getting first pick (8th) and the others picking in inverted succession. The two new franchises will then take the next two picks (13th and 19th). From that point, all further selections will be in inverse order of the standings at the end of the 1966-67 season with the two new cities drafting 11th and 12th. Kennedy pointed out if any NBA club has less than 11 players on its active list it cannot elect to protect a player after the first selection in

the professional player pool draft. Also, no first or second college draft choice may be sold by the new clubs for a period of one year from the draft date. A player selected from the professional player pool will not be permitted to return to the club placing said player in the pool until October 1, 1968, unless by waiver.
