An original play by a San Pedro school teacher will be premiered here Feb. 17, by Chapel Theatre.

"The Ebonite," by Luther Whittitt, concerns the life of a middle class Negro in the midst of a "white man's world."

The play is the first by Whittitt, who is a Negro. He has been commissioned to do a script for the Columbia Broadcasting System's "CBS Playhouse" by producers who read "The Ebonite."

"THIS PLAY is packed with such powerful dialogue, such stark realism that there is a tremendous impact to the viewer's emotions and mind," Betty Schroeder, publicity chairman for Chapel, said. "Yet, these are people with a great sense of humor and we see this, too."
