Mu Phi Epsilon Scholarship benefit concert, sponsored by the Palos Verdes Alumnae Chapter, will be presented by the Steiner-Berfield Trio, Sunday afternoon at 3:30, Feb. 12, in the Recital Hall of El Camino College.

This outstanding musical group, consisting of Diana Steiner, violin, Frances Steiner, cello, and David Berfield, piano, will perform the Trio in B flat major, by Mozart, the Kirchner Trio in Two Movements and the Trio in B minor, opus 8, by Brahms.

The Steiner sisters, graduates of the Curtis Institute of Music and each appearing in debut recitals at Town Hall, New York, have received unanimous praise of

critics and audiences nationwide for their concert engagements. Diana Steiner, violin soloist with the New York Philharmonic Orchestra at the age of nine and recipient of the Young Artist Award of the National Federation of Music Clubs, has made appearances with the Philadelphia Orchestra, Los Angeles Philharmonic, Chicago Symphony, and National Symphony of Washington D. C. She has studied with Efraim Zimbalist and Jascha Heifetz. Frances Steiner, a soloist at the age of 13 with the Philadelphia Orchestra and principal cellist of the New York Festival Orchestra in Lincoln Center, has studied with Gregor Piatigorsky and Gabor Rejto. She and her husband, Mervin Tarlow, are presently

residing in Gardena. David Berfield, graduate of the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, a Fulbright student in Paris under the tutelage of Nadia Boulanger, has performed with the Honolulu Symphony, the Los Angeles County Museum series, and the Monday Evening Concerts. He is now working with John Crown at the University of Southern California, where he holds a lectureship in the piano department.
