Refunds Due on State Disability Withholding

About \$3 million will be refunded in 1967 to wage earners who overpaid their disability insurance premiums last year and who apply for their refunds by June 30, Albert B. Tieburg, director of employment, has estimated.

Approximately 7 million California wage earners had payroll deductions for non-occupational disability insurance in 1966, and paid 1 percent of their first \$7,400 in wages for this insurance under provisions of the California Unemployment Insurance Code.

Persons who worked for two or more employers during the year may have had too much deducted for this purpose because each employer, as required by law, made a withholding for disability insurance. If the wage earner's total of deductions for this purpose exceeded \$74 for the year, he is entitled to a refund of the excess from the state.

More than 102,000 Californians applied for such refunds last year and received checks averaging \$28.46 for a total of \$2,719,398.51.

Such refunds, however, are not automatic. Persons entitled to them must complete and file the necessary claim form with the Department of Employment, 800 Capitol Mall, Sacramento 95814, postmarked no later than June 30, 1967. This form may be obtained at any of the department's field offices, or by writing to the above address.

If more than \$74 was deducted from a worker's wages for disability insurance because a business changed hands during the year, or because of error in making the deduction, then the worker should obtain the refund from his employer instead of the department. In this case, the employer may in turn be reimbursed by the Department of Employment, if he requests such reimbursement.

Utility Executive Given New Company Assignments

Southern California Gas Co. President F. M. Banks has been elected to the new position of chairman of the board and chief executive officer. W. M. Jacobs, currently president of Pacific Lighting Service and Supply Co., succeeds him as president, effective Feb. 1.

The moves were part of a series of changes in top positions made by the boards of directors of Pacific Lighting Corp.'s three gas utilities subsidiaries in view of the retirement of senior officers within the next two years.

In other Southern California Gas changes, senior vice president R. R. Blackburn and H. P. Letton Jr. are advancing to executive vice presidents.

In Pacific Lighting Service and Supply Co. changes, A. R. Bailey was named to succeed

Jacobs as president of that company. Bailey at present is vice president and assistant to the president.

Joseph R. Rensch is advancing from vice president to executive vice president of Pacific Lighting Service and Supply. Robert A. Hornby continues as chairman of the board.

At the same time, Southern Counties Gas Co. announced changes effective March 1. Guy W. Wadsworth will assume the new position of chairman of the board and chief executive officer. His successor as president is Bruce A. McCandless, president of Honolulu Gas Co., which has no affiliation with the Pacific Lighting System.
