

### Auxiliary To Sponsor Six Grants

Six scholarships for nursing students will be offered at Harbor College next fall following the presentation of a \$600 check to the college.

### Councilmen Oppose New Gas Taxes

The Lomita City Council has unanimously endorsed Supervisor Kenneth Hahn's stand urging the state gasoline tax not be increased.

A proposed increase of two cents a gallon to be used for the purchase of additional freeway rights-of-way has been discussed by the State Legislature.

Hahn said California motorists already pay one of the highest gas taxes in the nation. Present freeway right-of-way should be better utilized by double-decking freeways and developing rapid transit along the freeway routes, he added.

### Observatory Show on Telescopes Continues

Differences between refracting and reflection telescopes are explained and demonstrated during the current astronomy presentation "Wonders Revealed by the Telescope," offered until Feb. 5 at Griffith Park Observatory's planetarium theater.

How refracting telescopes work will be shown with the aid of the giant Zeiss projector, which will reproduce the image of an incandescent lamp on the theater's 75-foot domed ceiling. Dr. Clarence H. Clemmshaw, Observatory director for the Los Angeles City Recreation and Parks Department, said.

To illustrate the principle of the reflecting telescope lecturers will employ a concave mirror coated with aluminum. One of the world's largest telescopic complexes, located at Mt. Palomar, uses a mirror

200-inches in diameter. TELESCOPIC photographs of such celestial objects as star clusters and galaxies will be reproduced on the ceiling with the Zeiss projector.

"Wonders Revealed by the Telescope" will be shown at the famed observatory twice daily, except Monday, at 3 and 8:30 p.m. Two extra matinees are offered on weekends.

ADULTS ARE charged \$1 to see the presentation, students under 18, 50 cents. There is no charge for visitors to tour the Hall of Science, open to the public from 2 to 10 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and from 1 to 10 p.m. each weekend.

Also available is a large telescope through which visitors are able to scan the sky on clear nights from 7 until 10 p.m.

### \$9.5 Million Telephone Budget Set in South Bay

A record of \$9.5 million has been budgeted by General Telephone Co. to upgrade and expand services in the firm's South Bay Division during 1967, Harold R. Nelms, division manager, said today.

"This represents the largest annual expenditure General has ever budgeted for the South Bay area," Nelms said. The division serves customers in Hermosa Beach, Manhattan Beach, Palos Verdes, Lawndale, Redondo Beach, Rolling Hills, and Torrance.

Largest expenditure is some \$2.7 million for new telephone instruments and special attachments, Nelms said. Nearly \$2.5 million is earmarked for improvements to outside facilities and \$2.2 million for the purchase of land and buildings.

Another \$2 million will be spent for central office equipment, including direct distance dialing (DDD) facilities. Nelms said his division will be serving 130,000 telephones by the end of the year—an increase of about 10,000 during the year.

### Garden Checklist

1. If you haven't pruned your roses don't wait another day. They start coming to life again early in the year in California.
2. Be sure to clean up old leaves and clippings around the base of your roses; and give the plants a good dormant spray while you're at it.
3. Deciduous plants, including new bare root roses, should be heeled in, that is buried in moist soil, if the garden is too wet or you need to delay planting. Plant them as soon as the soil is workable after a rain.
4. Hydranges may be cut back to two or three leaf buds above the ground.
5. Carnations may be planted now. They are available from your local nursery in pots or plant bands, started and ready to go. Established carnations should be pinched back now to encourage bushier growth.
