


North, El Segundo Both Defeat Torrance Quint

Jones Wins '500'

Torrance auto racing champion Parnelli Jones drove his Vel's '67 Ford to an easy victory in the Motor Trend "500" at Riverside Sunday.

A crowd of 77,000, an increase of 16,000 over the previous week's rain-soaked crowd, saw Parnelli lead in 126 of Sunday's 185 laps.

Jones' winning purse was \$21,980 for the stock car extravaganza. He averaged 91.08 miles an hour over the twisty 2.7 Riverside course.

Parnelli dethroned Dan Gurney who won the previous four annual races. Dan blew out the rear end of his Mercury Cyclone while holding second place near the windup of the main event.

Placing second was Paul Goldsmith of Munster, Ind., in a 1966 Plymouth. Third was Norm Nelson of Racine, Wis., in a 1967 Plymouth.

With 365 gruelling miles remaining to be run when the race was interrupted a week earlier, Freddy Lorenzen of Elmhurst, Ill., was the leader, having taken over when Paul Goldsmith, Parnelli Jones, A. J. Foyt and four-time winner Dan Gurney all made pit stops under the yellow.

Lorenzen's '67 Ford Fairlane developed a flat right rear tire after the race was stopped, but according to NASCAR rules, none of the competing cars could be worked on in any way until after the race was restarted.

This meant Lorenzen had to move immediately to the pits for a new tire when the field took off. He made only a good race the rest of the day.

David Pearson led the first three laps; Jones, was in front for 17 laps, Foyt, a leader for 10 laps, Gurney led five circuits and Goldsmith had seven leading laps to his credit the first week.


